Missionary Update:

The Sturtevant Family Uganda

After 8 months of training, Jason has graduated his 1st class of 8 young, mechanics. The celebration took place yesterday afternoon, out under the mango tree. There were many speeches given, with kind words of advice for the graduates. All of them have a grandparent sponsored by ROTOM who is praying their newly trained mechanic will be able to get a job and help with the family income. All of the young men have dropped out of school because of lack of funds. Some only finished 3rd grade. Now they have another chance to start a career, in mechanics. Jason gave theory lessons in a classroom, but the majority of the time their classroom was under the shade tree, working on motorcycles, cars and trucks. They overhauled engines and learned troubleshooting. But even more that, Jason taught them about life and what is is to be a godly man. At the graduation many of the boys said Jason was more that a teacher to them. He was like a father. Most of their fathers are gone, but God promises to be a Father to the fatherless. (Psalm 68:5)

The best part of the graduation was when the grandparents & guest were still arriving. The boys all

gathered in a huddle and prayed. It brought tears to my eyes. Yes, they have learned mechanics in this class. But it has been so much more than that. Please pray for these 8 young men, that God will continue to work in their lives. Jason gave each of them a small, but nice tool set to help them on their way. He also gave them self respect, knowledge, friendship and a good example. These things will never fit in a tool box.

On a more personal note, we are once again asking our friends and supporters to pray about our children's visas. By the time we had collected all the documents the Ugandan government wanted, Jessica had turned 18. They have refused to give her a dependent's pass under Jason. They are saying she needs her own work permit which we are not even sure is possible. We know getting a work permit is very expensive and time consuming.

Pray for wisdom and direction in this situation. I truly believe if God closes a door, He will open another somewhere. We are trusting God to work out His perfect plan for Jessica, and our family. We are glad to be...
