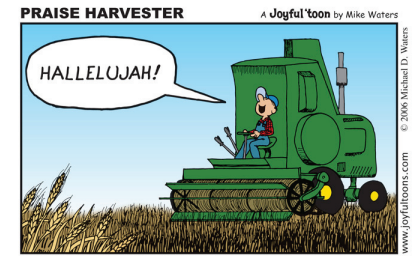

Missionary Update:

Byron and Melissa Manners Hope International Missions Taiwan

July 1st late in the evening we arrived back in Taiwan. We were immediately assaulted with high humidity, even at midnight. The jet lag was the worst we have ever dealt with. I don't know if it is because we are getting older or because we slept on the plane, but we had an awful time. I thought Sunday would help, but it did not. We had 46 that first week to welcome us back.

During the year I was gone, three people left the church. We did gain an older couple—James and Judy. He had been coming to Bible studies, so I already knew them somewhat. They are both stable Christians. I am very glad to have them in the church. It helps make up for the ones that left.

The coworkers have decided to make some changes in what we do. Missy is going to stop both of her Bible studies and take over the one I was doing on Monday evening. That way we both do one a week. That takes a load off me as I was spending more time preparing Bible studies than preparing sermons. When we became the

pastors of this church, we had very little visiting to do. Now more opportunities have opened up, and I need more time to visit. So the change with the Bible study schedule is welcome.

August was a pretty busy month except for the day we were forced to stay inside due to a visit from Typhoon Soudelor.

We have also made some changes in the worship service with more time given to prayer. However, there were some kinks that needed to be worked out. One of my interpreters told Missy that she is struggling with my long sermons. I did not think that 25 minutes was that long, but that is a long time for the interpreter to have to think and talk. 25 minutes turns into 50 minutes when everything has to be said twice.

The last Sunday of the month I preached on prayer. I am especially concerned that the church is not reaching out very well. I sensed an unusual sense of the Lord's presence. I preached close to an hour, and people did not seem restless. Service went an hour and forty-five minutes, unusually long. For me at least the month ended on a high note.
