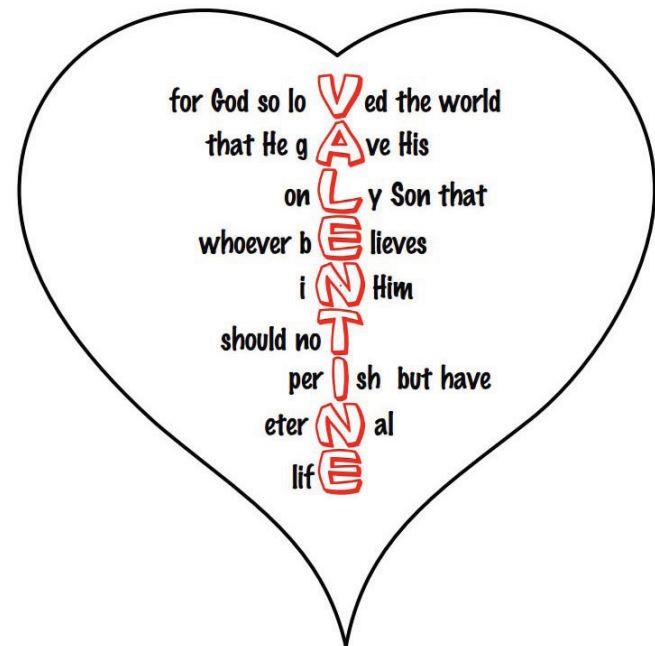

Missionary Update

The Motovilov Family South Africa

This summer has turned out to be unusually hot. Old-timers say they do not remember such a hot dry summer at least in the last 20 years. Many areas are left without good drinking water, especially for the cattle. We thank God for giving us some occasional rain, but we need a lot more. Our vegetables that we planted look quite pitiful, which we, with all confidence, can blame on the drought and different climate rather than on our poor gardening experience.

The school property in Maursnek is a nice facility which we thought could be used for English Bible classes similar to what we did in Russia. Since we are new to the culture here, we had some things to learn about inviting people to our lessons. We made invitations and passed them out in the Maursnek area for people to come to a meeting about having Bible classes at the school. We set a time and date to meet. When the time came, no one showed up for the meeting. There were quite a few children outside the fence observing us. Glenn suggested that we just go and invite all the children we see on the street to come for a class. We did just that and had about 20 children who came. The school does have a pretty nice playground, which is a great incentive for local children. We allowed them to play there before and after the class. We pray that this ministry would grow and children would learn to come to our Bible classes regularly and on

time. We see that we easily could have two groups of children coming every week. We hope and pray that God would also bring some people together for us to have an adult Bible class in that area, which would be a springboard to starting a church there in the future.

At the time of our last newsletter we were getting ready for the end of the school year program. You have heard already that it was also the end of Hope Christian Academy, at least for the time being. God opened its doors 8 years ago, and now He has closed them. We know that God is in control of everything, and His timing is always perfect. We had a very nice end of the year program. All the parents came to see their children perform in a play and receive their hard-earned academic awards. In the last week of school we talked to the children about letting their lights shine for Jesus as they left and went out into a new school. We pray they carry this little light that they found and not let it go out as they go through life and face opposition from the world. It has been a time of transition for us as well. We are again homeschooling our children. We have been praying for God's leadership on how we can best apply ourselves here after the school closed.
