It was the best of months; it was the worst of months. The good part I referred to in November. I had the privilege of finishing out the last Sunday of the year baptizing Jeffery and Erica.

The bad part of the month concerned Emmy, my main interpreter and lead coworker. We knew back in September that she had cancer in her womb, but we thought it was not a big deal. She scheduled to go into the hospital the second week of December to have surgery, but she never came out. The cancer was already in her liver. The doctor told her it was stage four and they could not operate. Early January 5 she went to be with the Lord. She was only 54, and my best church member. She could teach children's Sunday School without help, interpret, and was chairwoman of the coworkers while I was gone for furlough. Most importantly, she was a good example of Christian womanhood. Needless to say, this has been a real blow to the church.

For Christmas this year, I decided to celebrate Advent. That meant that right after Thanksgiving, we started Christmas. Getting candles here was not easy, and we did not find the right colors, but we did what we could.

We also had our annual church business meeting in December. I got a unanimous two-year call as pastor. I think this is the first time I did not have votes against me. Things have been much smoother since I came back. Someone told me I am a better pastor now. I don't know if it is maturing or what, but I think more people praying for us has something to do with it.

I am thankful for the time with our families last year during Christmas, but it was not normal for me. Christmas is about ministry here, and that is the way I like it. I trust God will use the messages given to bring souls to our wonderful Lord Jesus.
